Students are required to complete PSY 105 (WVU PSYC 105) with a C- or better to be admitted to the Psychology program upon transferring to WVU.

\*\*Students will need to work with their advisor closely regarding Eberly College of Arts & Sciences' 42-hour rule during their time at WVU. There is no limit to the number of credits students can earn in a subject. However, in Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) programs in the Eberly College, a maximum of forty-two hours in one subject (e.g., BIOL, FRCH, POLS) may be counted toward the minimum hours for graduation. If a B.A. student exceeds forty-two credits in one subject, then the excess must be matched by an equal number of credits in any other subject.

Students completing degrees in WVU's Eberly College of Arts and Sciences are encouraged to work with their advisors to integrate completion of an academic minor or minors into their programs of study, to the degree allowed within elective hours. WVU offers over 100 minors that complement major fields of study, build on students' unique interests, expand perspectives, and broaden skills. Students may begin completion of a minor by utilizing elective credit to take courses at Lackawanna College equivalent to minor required courses at WVU.

Students transferring to West Virginia University with an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree will have satisfied the General Education Foundation requirements at WVU.


