Students must have a 2.0 GPA in HIS courses to be admitted directly into the History program upon transferring to West Virginia University.

**Students will fulfill the West Virginia University History program's Introductory History Course requirements. Only three are required, the additional course will go towards required electives.

Students will have the option to select from several regions and courses to complete their History Concentration. Students must complete at least one course in all three of the following regions, with twelve of the total 18 hours at the 300 or 400 level.

- Take one History course in each geographical concentration area:
 - o US, Europe, and Africa/Asia/Latin America
- Take three (3) additional History courses (no geographical req).
- 18 total credits-of which 12 credits must be at the 300/400 level.

*EDG 4: Global and Regional Perspectives will be fulfilled by the Africa, Asia, and Latin America Major Requirement.
