Credits earned via equivalents with Fruits of Labor fall under the West Virginia University system's Credit for Prior Learning policy and process. If coursework is completed prior to admission to Potomac State, students are encouraged to coordinate with their assigned advisor to complete a request to have that credit articulated. This will aid in the accurate advising of the student's first term at PSC. Additional credits earned via FoL after enrollment will also need to be requested via this process:

If students are working with the Fruits of Labor program, but not working toward one of the certifications above, they are eligible to register for AFCS 491 Professional Field Experience for the number of credits appropriate for the hours they will be working during the semester it is taken. These credits will count toward elective credits or Area of Concentration.

*Highlighted courses above are classes that should be taken from WVU-Potomac State College (or in the WVU system). If students have earned credit for PLSC 206/206L with completion of AGRI 120 and AGRI 210, that can count toward the Natural Science Requirement.

Potomac State College's Credit Residence Requirement:

In order to meet residency requirements at WVU Potomac State College for an associate degree, students who have completed all undergraduate work in another West Virginia public higher education system must complete at least 18 hours of work at WVU Potomac State College; 8 of the last 16 hours must be on campus, or complete the final 15 credit hours of work at PSC.

(Courses taken on any WVU campus will count toward the residence requirement)
