Students who maintain a 2.0 GPA will be directly admitted into the Journalism program upon transferring to West Virginia University. Those students who have below a 2.0 GPA must have a C- or better in COMM 2300 (MDIA 215S) to be admitted into the Journalism program within the College of Creative Arts and Media upon transferring.

^Students are required to complete STAT 111 as a College of Creative Arts and Media requirement. Students who complete MTH 1015at CSMD, will have completed the WVU equivalent of STAT 211, therefore, the STAT 111 requirement will be fulfilled as well as the Math Requirement at WVU. The student will need to complete an elective to meet the 120-hour WVU requirement.

\*In place of the THREE required, one-hour skills classes listed (ex: JRL 235S or JRL236S, JRL 237S, JRL 238S, JRL 240S) students in the COM at WVU, may opt to take ONE three-hour skills class approved by their advisor.

\*Some JRL Capstones require pre-reqs. Students must let their advisor know if they want to purse an area of 'Specialization.' For example: If you want to pursue a broadcast/tv track and want to take JRL 487S as your capstone course (WVU News) you must take JRL 335S one semester, followed by JRL 386S the next semester; prior to the JRL 487S capstone your senior year.

\*\*Students who wish to pursue other foreign language options other than Spanish should select other "Humanities Elective" options as CSMD. Students will need to use the "Elective" slots to complete their 6-hours of foreign language studies at WVI.

Journalism majors are required to declare a minor. Students should work with their faculty advisor to complete this task.

Students transferring to West Virginia University with an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree will have satisfied the General Education Foundation requirements at WVU.

Students who have questions about admission into their intended program, GEF requirements, or any other issue relating to academics at West Virginia University should contact the Office of Undergraduate Education at WVU.
