Student will fulfill EDG 4: Global and Regional Perspectives by completing the Africa, Asia, and Latin America Major Requirement.

Students who wish to complete a United States' concentration course option should select HIST 161 (HIST 257) or HIST 107 (HIST 261) as an elective during their HACC years.

Students will have the option to select from several regions and courses to complete their History Concentration. Students must complete at least one course in all three of the following regions, with twelve of the total 18 hours at the 300 or 400 level.

- Take one History course in each geographical concentration area:
  - o US, Europe, and Africa/Asia/Latin America
- Take three (3) additional History courses (no geographical req).
- 18 total credits-of which 12 credits must be at the 300/400 level.

Students transferring to West Virginia University with an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree will have satisfied the General Education Foundation requirements at WVU.
