Students will have the option to select from several regions and courses to complete their History Concentration. Students must complete at least one course in all three of the following regions, with 12 of the total 18 hours at the 300 or 400 level.

- Take one History course in each geographical concentration area:
 - o US, Europe, and Africa/Asia/Latin America
- Take three (3) additional History courses (no geographical req).
- 18 total credits-of which 12 credits must be at the 300/400 level.

Students pursuing a degree in History from West Virginia University are required to complete an academic minor. Depending on the chosen minor, students may complete the 100 & 200 level course requirements via General Education courses from Lackawanna College. WVU offers over 100 minors that complement major fields of study, build on students' unique interests, expand perspectives, and broaden skills.
