• IT 134 = CIS 241

• IT 242 = CIS 118

• IT 135 = CIS 107

• IT 239 = CIS 2TC

In addition, several courses within the Eastern WV program share the same equivalencies to WVU courses. This will result in repeat indicators being applied to all previous completed courses. The final course grade will be the one resulting on the student's record and all other will fall into the "Repeat" category on the student's record and the hours not counted towards graduation. Students will need to take additional credit to earn the required 120 for graduation. They should work closely with their faculty/academic advisor to complete these remaining credits.

Students transferring to West Virginia University with an Associate of Arts, Associate of Applied Science, or Associate of Science degree will have satisfied the General Education Foundation requirements at WVU.
