Students transferring into the Criminology program at West Virginia University must have a C- or better in SOC 101 (WVU SOC 101).

\*Although ENG 101 & 102 are not equivalent to West Virginia University's ENGL 101 & 102, they will be accepted by West Virginia University to satisfy the GEF 1 requirement per the WV HEPC Core Coursework Agreement.

Unlike other WVNCC plans, this agreement is a Applied Science degree which does not satisfied the General Education Foundation requirements at WVU. Students will need to complete those courses in their last two years. Students can work with their academic advisor to select courses.

Students completing degrees in WVU's Eberly College of Arts and Sciences are encouraged to work with their advisors to integrate completion of an academic minor or minors into their programs of study, to the degree allowed within elective hours. WVU offers over 100 minors that complement major fields of study, build on students' unique interests, expand perspectives, and broaden skills. See
