Course sequence may change based on the individual needs of the student and schedule type required.

New college students may be required during their first semester to participate in GEN 1070, First Year Success Seminar, a one credit hour course. See a Tri-C Counselor for details.

This represents an example of suggested courses to complete the Associate of Arts to continue for a bachelor's degree, which must total at least 60 semester credits and includes 36 Ohio Transfer 36 (OT36) credits which are approved Tri-C general education requirements. OT36 details can be found at https://www.ohiohighered.org/Ohio-Transfer-36. Students should work closely with advisors at both institutions to discuss options.

\*Students need to complete only MATH 1530 (MATH 126) for some majors in the Chambers College of Business and Economics. Students will need to complete MATH 1480 (MATH 150) with a C- or higher only if pursuing one of these majors: Applied AI and Data Analytics; Economics, Finance, Supply Chain Management, and Management Information Systems.

^ Students must take Arts & Humanities courses from two different disciplines.

Although not directly equivalent to WVU's ACCT 201 and ACCT 201, Tri-C's ACCT 1311 and ACCT 1341 will be utilized as substation for WVU's Financial and Managerial Accounting requirements.

To be admitted to the John Chambers College of Business and Economics, students must have an overall GPA of 2.25. Students must also complete the following College of Business and Economics prerequisite courses with a minimum grade of C- or better:

- ACCT 1311 & ACCT 1341
- ECON 2000 & ECON 2010
- ENGL 1010 & ENGL 1020

- MATH 1530 & MATH 1480 (if necessary)
- IT 1090
- MATH 1420 or MATH 1490

Students completing this proposed pathway may choose to major within one of the following Chambers College of Business and Economics fields: Accounting; Applied AI and Data Analytics; Economics; Entrepreneurship and Innovation; Finance; General Business; Hospitality & Tourism; Human Resource Management; Management Information Systems; Marketing; or Supply Chain Management. Applied AI and Data Analytics requires only BCOR 330 once students are enrolled at WVU. Academic advisors will create this plan of study.

Additional criteria for admissions must also be met for specific programs, see below course or equivalent course requirements:

- Accounting: A grade of B- or higher in ACCT 1311 & 1341; A minimum grade of C- in MATH 1530.
- Applied AI and Data Analytics: A minimum grade of C- in MATH 1480.
- Economics: One B- or higher, and one C- or higher in ECON 2000 & 2010; A minimum grade of C- in MATH 1480.
- Entrepreneurship and Innovation: minimum grade of C- in MATH 1530.
- Finance: A grade of B- or higher in ECON 2000 & 2010; A minimum grade of C- in MATH 1480.
- General Business: minimum grade of C- in MATH 1530.
- Hospitality & Tourism: minimum grade of C- in MATH 1530.
- Human Resource Management: minimum grade of C- in MATH 1530.
- Management Information System: minimum grade of C- in MATH 1480.
- Marketing: minimum grade of C- in MATH 1530.
- Supply Chain Management: A minimum grade of C- in MATH 1480.

Students transferring to West Virginia University with an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree will have satisfied the General Education Foundation requirements at WVU.
