Students transferring into the Criminology program at West Virginia University must have a C- or better in SOC 101 (WVU SOC 101) and complete ANTH 105 (WVU) during their first semester.

Students transferring to West Virginia University with an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree will have satisfied the General Education Foundation requirements at WVU.

Bachelor's degrees at WVU require a minimum of 120 credit hours. Students should work with their academic advisors on the appropriate use of elective credit to reach that minimum.

Students completing degrees in WVU's Eberly College of Arts and Sciences are encouraged to work with their advisors to integrate completion of an academic minor or minors into their programs of study, to the degree allowed within elective hours. WVU offers over 100 minors that complement major fields of study, build on students' unique interests, expand perspectives, and broaden skills. Allegheny County students may begin completion of certain minors at CCAC by utilizing *Elective* hours to take courses equivalent to the minor's introductory requirements at WVU.
