Course sequence may change based on the individual needs of the student and schedule type required.

New college students may be required during their first semester to participate in GEN 1070, First Year Success Seminar, a one credit hour course. See a Tri-C Counselor for details.

This represents an example of suggested courses to complete the Associate of Arts to continue for a bachelor's degree, which must total at least 60 semester credits and includes 36 Ohio Transfer 36 (OT36), credits which are approved Tri-C general education requirements. OT36 details can be found at https://www.ohiohighered.org/Ohio-Transfer-36. Students should work closely with advisors at both institutions to discuss options.

Students who maintain a 2.0 GPA will be directly admitted into the Journalism program upon transferring to West Virginia University. Those students who have below a 2.0 GPA must have a C- or better in MJS 20101 (MDIA 215S) to be admitted into the Journalism program within the College of Creative Arts and Media upon transferring.

^In place of the THREE required, one-hour skills classes listed (ex: JRL 235S, JRL 236S, JRL 237S, JRL 238S, or JRL 240S students in the School of Media and Communications at WVU may opt to take ONE three-hour skills class approved by their advisor.

Some JRL Capstones require pre-reqs. Students must let their advisor know if they want to pursue an area of 'Specialization.' For example: If you want to pursue a broadcast/TV track and want to take JRL 487S as your capstone course (WVU News) you must take JRL 335S one semester, followed by JRL 386S the next semester; prior to the JRL 487S capstone your senior year.

Students transferring to West Virginia University with an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree will have satisfied the General Education Foundation requirements at WVU.
