## Matriculation Policies

- Students must earn at least a grade of "C-" in all professional education courses to remain in the BA Elementary Education program. Earning a grade less than a "C-" may result in the student being removed from the program. In this event, the student must contact an advisor immediately.
- Students who arrange to receive a grade of "I" (incomplete) must complete all requirements to change the incomplete to a grade prior to the beginning of the next semester. If the student does NOT get the grade of "I" changed to a passing grade, the student will NOT be able to matriculate the next semester. In this event, the student must contact an advisor immediately.
- Students must maintain at least a 2.5 grade point average to remain in the BA Elementary Education program. If the student has less than a 2.25 overall GPA, the student must meet with their advisor to discuss their options moving forward. In most cases, if the student has between 2.25 and a 2.49 and/or has earned a grade less than C- in a professional education course, the student will be placed on probation for one semester and a plan of improvement will be developed with program faculty and staff. If the student has not improved the overall GPA to at least a 2.5 and/or repeated the professional education course with at least a C- at the end of that probationary semester, the student may be dismissed from the program. The students' progress will be evaluated by the program faculty and staff at the end of that period.
- If the student has not yet completed GEF requirements at the end of the sophomore year, the student must meet with their advisor at the beginning of the fall semester of their junior year to develop a plan to meet this requirement.
- If the student has not yet met the pre-professional skills requirements at the end of the sophomore year, the student must meet with their advisor at the beginning of the fall semester of their junior year to develop a plan to meet this requirement.
- If the student has not completed the required fingerprinting and background check requirements, the student must meet with the Field and Clinical Experiences Placement Coordinator. Without a complete fingerprinting and background check, the student will not be able to begin field/clinical experiences. This will delay their progress in the program as well as their graduation.

## **Testing Benchmarks**

## WV State Certification Requirements

- Pre-professional skills. Students may meet the pre-professional skills requirement by either passing the Praxis Core test or by earning a B or better in designated courses. These are typically MATH 124, ENGL 101, and ENGL 102. Please see your advisor for more information. These are to be met to be admitted into the Professional Component of the program following the sophomore year.
- Praxis II/Elementary Education test [NOTE: Successful completion of this assessment is required prior to the final semester, Residency 2; scores must be received prior to the first day of the Residency 2 placement.]
- Praxis II Elementary Education Teaching reading test. [NOTE: Successful completion of this assessment is required prior to the final semester, Residency 2; scores must be received by the end of November of the Residency 1 semester.]
- edTPA, Teacher Performance Assessment: Required as part of the Residency 2 semester. [NOTE: Submission of this assessment for national scoring is required for WVU degree program completion. A passing score on this assessment is required prior to applying for a WV teaching license.]

WVDE Policy 5100 about residency requirements:

- 6.8. Yearlong Residency Minimum Requirements.
  - o 6.8.a. Effective July 1, 2021, with the freshman cohort, all EPPs with WVBE-approved programs of study leading to West Virginia educator licensure must begin the transition to a full residency model by including a minimum of one program with a yearlong residency pathway as the final clinical experience as defined in section 5 for candidates completing their program. All educator preparation content areas will transition to The West Virginia Residency Model no later than the Fall of 2024 with incoming freshman cohorts.
  - 6.8.b. Authorization. The agreement established between an IHE, and county board of education must be approved by the WVBE.
  - 6.8.c. Each candidate shall complete a Residency 1 and Residency 2 clinical experience for two consecutive semesters
    in the clinical portion of the program unless the candidate is able to demonstrate to the satisfaction of the college
    supervisor and the cooperating public school cooperating teacher that the candidate has achieved the proficiency
    level in less than the specified time.

Students transferring to West Virginia University with an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree will have satisfied the General Education Foundation requirements at WVU.
