Students must have a GPA of 2.0 in all ENGL courses to be admitted to the English program upon transferring to West Virginia University.

\*Historical Breadth Courses: ENGL 241, ENGL 242, ENGL 261, or ENGL 262

Student will need to select one of the following Areas of Emphasis:

- Creative Writing
- Literary and Cultural Studies
- Professional Writing and Editing (PWE)

\*\*There is no limit to the number of credits students can earn in a subject. However, in Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) programs in the Eberly College, a maximum of forty-two hours in one subject (e.g., ENGL) may be counted toward the minimum hours for graduation. If a B.A. student exceeds forty-two credits in one subject, then the excess must be matched by an equal number of credits in any other subject. Student will need to complete an additional course (3 credit hours) to compensate for the excess number of credits earned in English.

Students completing degrees in WVU's Eberly College of Arts and Sciences are encouraged to work with their advisors to integrate completion of an academic minor or minors into their programs of study, to the degree allowed within elective hours. WVU offers over 100 minors that complement major fields of study, build on students' unique interests, expand perspectives, and broaden skills.

Students transferring to West Virginia University with an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree will have satisfied the General Education Foundation requirements at WVU.


