Students who are part of this agreement will be admitted to the Criminology program upon transferring to West Virginia University, so long as they have a C- or better in SO 101 (SOC 101).

*Students are highly encouraged to complete MA 112 (STAT 215) to complete their statistic requirement before transferring to WVU. Both SOC 301 and SOC 311 require students to have completed the statistics course prior to enrolling in those courses.

MA 112 is equivalent to WVU'S STAT 215. It will substitute for the required STAT 211.
