
Students must have completed PSY 101 (WVU PSYC 101) with a C- or better, in order to be admitted directly into the Psychology program at West Virginia University.

Students completing degrees in WVU’s Eberly College of Arts and Sciences are encouraged to work with their advisors to integrate completion of an academic minor or minors into their programs of study, to the degree allowed within elective hours. WVU offers over 100 minors that complement major fields of study, build on students’ unique interests, expand perspectives, and broaden skills. WVNCC students may begin completion of certain minors at WVNCC by utilizing Elective hours to take courses equivalent to the minor’s introductory requirements at WVU.
