To be admitted to the Criminology program, students must complete SOCI 1010 (SOC 101) with a grade of C- or higher.

Students must maintain a GPA of 2.0 overall and a minimum GPA of 2.0 in all CRIM, SOC, and ANTH courses counting toward major requirements.

Students transferring to West Virginia University with an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree will have satisfied the General Education Foundation requirements at WVU.

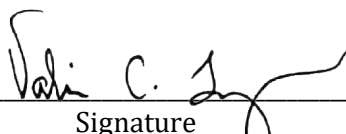
