\*Students who complete HIT 260 (WVU HIST 250) and select the “United States” as an “Area of Concentration” will have completed the 200-level course for that concentration and can replace that course with an elective. Students who do not wish to peruse “United States” as an concentration will need to follow the plan as presented.

Students must have a 2.0 GPA in HIS courses to be admitted directly into the History program upon transferring to West Virginia University. Students must earn a minimum GPA of 2.2 with no grade lower than a C- in all courses applied to the History Major Requirements.

Students transferring to West Virginia University with an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree will have satisfied the General Education Foundation requirements at WVU.

Students completing degrees in WVU’s Eberly College of Arts and Sciences are encouraged to work with their advisors to integrate completion of an academic minor or minors into their programs of study, to the degree allowed within elective hours. WVU offers over 100 minors that complement major fields of study, build on students’ unique interests, expand perspectives, and broaden skills. See


