\*Students must successfully complete MATH 150 to fulfill B.S. requirements. MATH 126 or higher must be completed before enrolling in PSYC 203. PSYC 101 (PSY 200) with a C- must be completed before enrolling in PSYC 203. Students completing MTH 135 at Eastern West Virginia will only earn credit for MATH 126.

\*\*Students will only need to take one additional 300/400-level PSYC course at WVU if students elect to complete PSYC 228 (PSYC 364) at Eastern West Virginia Community College.

Students completing degrees in WVU's Eberly College of Arts and Sciences are encouraged to work with their advisors to integrate completion of an academic minor or minors into their programs of study, to the degree allowed within elective hours. WVU offers over 100 minors that complement major fields of study, build on students' unique interests, expand perspectives, and broaden skills. Eastern WV students may begin completion of certain minors at Eastern West Virginia Community and Technical College by utilizing *elective* hours to take courses equivalent to the minor's introductory requirements at WVU.


Students transferring to West Virginia University with an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree will have satisfied the General Education Foundation requirements at WVU.
