  - Students can complete NSG 455 while enrolled at WVU, if necessary.

- RN licensure

\*A two-semester option is available. Students require a total of 120 hours to be eligible for graduation.

The School of Nursing offers in-state tuition for all students enrolled in the RN-BSN program, regardless of residency. All registered nurses will transfer 50-hours of undifferentiated nursing credit based on RN licensure.

The University waives the GEF requirements for those with a previous bachelor's degree, Associate of Arts degree, Associate of Applied Science, or Associate of Science degree, but the student is still required to complete nursing general education requirements. RN to BSN general education requirements, regarding of University GEF credit requirements, include ENGL 101 (ENGL 101), ENGL 102 (ENGL 102), and MATH 210 (STAT 211).

Students who do not complete their statics requirement at NRCTC, can complete NSG 455: Interpreting Data for Evidence Based Nursing Care at the WVU and this will satisfy their statistics requirement.

Students receiving federal financial aid should work with their academic advisor to meet requirements for renewal, which often includes a minimum of twelve degree-pursuant hours.

Students transferring to West Virginia University with an Associate of Arts, Associate of Applied Science, or Associate of Science degree will have satisfied the General Education Foundation requirements at WVU.

Students who have questions regarding this articulation agreement or the transferability of coursework may contact the WVU Office of the University Registrar. All other questions should be directed to the WVU Office of Admissions.
