New college students may be required during their first semester to participate in GEN 1070, First Year Success Seminar, a one credit hour course. See a Tri-C Counselor for details.

This transfer pathway indicates one way to earn an Associate of Arts degree which must total at least 60 semester credits and includes 36 Ohio Transfer 36 (OT36) credits which are approved Tri-C general education requirements. Students must complete all A.A.S requirements prior to graduating from Potomac with their B.A.S. In the above agreement, students transferring from Tri-C will need to complete the following during their time at Potomac State:

- Any three (3) additional Lower-Level Major Electives that were not taken at their original institution.
 - Select from: CJ 111, CJ 204, CJ 206, CJ 233, CJ 236, CJ 245, CJ 255, or CJ 295

*Courses listed may be taken at any point during a student's progression toward this degree. This includes during the summer transitioning between Cuyahoga Community College and Potomac State College, as well as via approved equivalents at Potomac State. Students should consult with academic advising to determine when completion of these courses is best suited for them.


Upper-Level Major Electives (Select four) – 12 credits:

- CJ 301, CJ 302, CJ 316, CJ 324, CJ 325, CJ 415 CJ 461, CJ 493.

Students transferring into the Bachelor of Applied Science (B.A.S) program can anticipate completing additional required lower-level A.A.S courses during their B.A.S degree pursuits. Students can substitute online upper-level elective courses to complete those lower-level requirements. Students transferring to West Virginia University with an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree will have satisfied the General Education Foundation requirements at WVU.
