*SOC 101 or PSYC 101 is required by all John Chamber College of Business & Economics majors, except for Economics. Those students pursuing a degree in a field other than Economics are encouraged to take either SOC 101 or PSYC 101 at ACM to better align credit hour totals to the minimum 120-hour requirements.

To be admitted to the John Chambers College of Business and Economics, students must have an overall GPA of 2.5. Students must also complete the following College of Business and Economics prerequisite courses with a minimum grade of C or better:

- BUAD 207 & 215
- ECON 201 & 202
- ENG 101 & 102
- MTH 109 & 200
- COMP 101

Students completing the above articulated plan of study may choose to enroll in any of the following College of Business & Economics programs: Accounting; Economics; Entrepreneurship & Innovation; Finance; General Business; Global Supply Chain Management; Hospitality & Tourism; Management; Management Information Systems; Marketing; Organizational Leadership.

Depending upon the student's choice of major, additional criteria for admissions must also be met:

- Accounting: Minimum grade of B or higher in BUAD 207 & 215. Minimum grade of C in MTH 200.
- Economics: Minimum One B or higher, and one C or higher in ECON 201 and ECON 202; a grade of B or higher in MTH 200.
- Entrepreneurship & Innovation: Minimum grade of D in MTH 200.
- Finance: Minimum grade of B or higher in ECON 201 & ECON 202; a grade of B in MTH 200.
- General Business: Minimum grade of D in MTH 200.
- Global Supply Chain Management: Minimum B or higher in MTH 200.
- Hospitality & Tourism: Minimum grade of D in MTH 200.
- Management: Minimum grade of C in MTH 200.
- Management Information Systems: Minimum grade of B or higher in MTH 200.
- Marketing: Minimum grade of C in MTH 200.
- Organizational Leadership: Minimum grade of C in MTH 200.

Students transferring to West Virginia University with an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree will have satisfied the General Education Foundation requirements at WVU.
