Suggested Plan of Study



To follow the outline plan of study below at West Virginia University, students must have the following:

- ENGL 101 and ENGL 102 taken at Bridge Valley Community & Technical College.
- STAT 211 or its equivalent will need to be taken prior to enrolling at WVU.
- Associate of Science in Nursing
- RN licensure

A two-semester option is available. Students require a total of 120 hours to be eligible for graduation.

The School of Nursing offers in-state tuition for all students enrolled in the RN-BSN program, regardless of residency. All registered nurses will transfer 50 hours of undifferentiated nursing credit based on RN licensure.

The University waives the GEF requirements for those with a previous bachelor's degree, Associate of Arts degree, or Associate of Science degree, but the student is still required to complete nursing general education requirements. RN to BSN general education requirements, regarding University GEF credit requirements, include ENGL 101 (ENGL 101 or ENGL 101E), ENGL 102 (ENGL 102), and STAT 211.

Students will need to complete ENGL 102 at Bridge Valley and complete STAT 211 or its equivalent prior to applying for the RN-BSN program.

Students receiving federal financial aid should work with their academic advisor to meet requirements for renewal, which often includes a minimum of twelve degree-pursuant hours.

Students transferring to West Virginia University with an Associate of Arts, Associate of Applied Science or Associate of Science degree will have satisfied the General Education Foundation requirements at WVU.

Students who have questions regarding this articulation agreement or the transferability of coursework may contact the WVU Office of the University Registrar. All other questions should be directed at the WVU Office of Admissions.
