\*Students are recommended to select a Non-History Elective among their subject options in their third semester at College of Southern Maryland. Students are limited to completing 42-hours of one subject matter may be counted toward the minimum hours for graduation.

Students at Southern Maryland may utilize their HST Electives to take HST 1019 (WVU's HIST 203) which is courses in the European region respectively.

Students will have the option to select from several regions and courses to complete their History Concentration. Students must complete at least one course in all three of the following regions, with twelve of the total 18 hours at the 300 or 400 level.


- Take one History course in each geographical concentration area:
  - US, Europe, and Africa/ Asia/ Latin America
- Take three (3) additional History courses (no geographical req).
- 18 total credits-of which 12 credits must be at the 300/400 level.

Students pursuing a degree in History from West Virginia University are required to complete an academic minor. Depending on the chosen minor, students may complete the 100 & 200 level course requirements via General Education courses from College of Southern Maryland. WVU offers over 100 minors that complement major fields of study, build on students' unique interests, expand perspectives, and broaden skills. Students transferring to West Virginia University with an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree will have satisfied the General Education Foundation requirements at WVU.
