
Students who are part of this Articulation Agreement will be admitted to the Criminology program upon transferring to WVU, so long as they have a C- or higher in SOCI 1101 (WVU SOC 101). They will need to enroll in ANTH 105 during their first term.

Students completing degrees in WVU's Eberly College of Arts and Sciences are encouraged to work with their advisors to integrate completion of an academic minor or minors into their programs of study, to the degree allowed within elective hours. WVU offers over 100 minors that complement major fields of study, build on students' unique interests, expand perspectives, and broaden skills.

Students transferring to West Virginia University with an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree will have satisfied the General Education Foundation requirements at WVU. However, as this is an Associate of Applied Science (A.A.S.) it does not be those qualifications. Students will need to complete all outstanding GEF requirements prior to graduation.
