EDG 4: Global and Regional Perspectives will be fulfilled by the Africa, Asia, and Latin America Major Requirement.

Students must have a 2.0 GPA in HIS courses to be admitted directly into the History program upon transferring to West Virginia University.

Students will have the option to select from several regions and courses to complete their History Concentration. Students must complete at least one course in all three of the following regions, with twelve of the total 18 hours at the 300 or 400 level.

- Take one History course in each geographical concentration area:
 - o US, Europe, and Africa/Asia/Latin America
- Take three (3) additional History courses (no geographical req).
- 18 total credits-of which 12 credits must be at the 300/400 level.

WVU offers over 100 minors that complement major fields of study, build on students' unique interests, expand perspectives, and broaden skills. Westmoreland students may begin completion of certain minors at WCCC by utilizing *Elective* hours to take courses equivalent to the minor's introductory requirements at WVU.

Students transferring to West Virginia University with an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree will have satisfied the General Education Foundation requirements at WVU.
