- Complete remaining two (2) Lower-Level Major Electives (LLME) that were not taken during at their original institution. Select from: CJ 111, CJ 204, CJ 233, CJ 236, CJ 245, CJ 255, or CJ 295

Upper-Level Major Electives (Select four) – 12 credits:

- CJ 301, CJ 302, CJ 316, CJ 324, CJ 325, CJ 415, CJ 461, CJ 493

Students transferring into the Bachelor of Applied Science (B.A.S) online program can anticipate completing additional required Lower-Level Major Elective A.A.S courses during their B.A.S. degree pursuits. Students can substitute upper-level elective courses to complete those lower-level requirements.

Students transferring to West Virginia University with an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree will have satisfied the General Education Foundation requirements at WVU.


