For this agreement:

- ** Student will need to plan to take SOWK 147 & SOWK 151 online at WVU-Online to complete the course work.
 - If the student wishes to matriculate into the on-campus program, they can complete [this application](#) and then enroll in the online course with a 900-level section.
 - If the student wishes to matriculate into the online program, they can complete [this application](#) and then enroll in the online course with a 700-level section.
- Students should plan to complete this course the summer between their first and second year.

Transfer students, including 2+2 students, who wish to enter the Social Work major must contact WVU's Office of Admissions and the B.S.W. Program Director no later than the semester before they intend to matriculate to WVU. Students planning to transfer to WVU should work closely with the WVU School of Social Work to ensure all admission and progression requirements are met prior to beginning Year 3 Social Work coursework.

Upper-division social work courses taken at other institutions do not automatically transfer to WVU and satisfy program requirements. To receive approval for these courses, students must have earned a grade of B- or higher, completed the course through a CSWE-accredited program, and submit course syllabi and other relevant materials to the B.S.W. Program Director for review. Courses that are not approved will count as electives. Lower-division social work courses offered through approved 2+2 partner institutions have been accepted through the formal articulation agreement.

To be eligible to begin Year 3 social work coursework at WVU, students must:

- Earn a final grade of C- or higher in SOWK 147 and SOWK 151 or approved transfer equivalent.
- Maintain a minimum overall GPA of 2.0.

Students are required to complete 50 hours of human service experience by April 1 of the second semester of Year 3. These hours must be completed in coordination with the WVU School of Social Work. Students should contact the WVU School of Social Work prior to beginning their human service hours to ensure the experience meets program requirements.

Students who transfer from another institution with 60 or more credits or who transfer from another WVU college with 60 or more WVU credits are eligible to take ARSC 360 instead of the 4 courses that comprise Eberly Edge 1-4. Students can request a permit by filling out the Eberly Edge Transfer Permit Request form. (This form will be available in the fall of 2026 for registration for spring 2027).

Students transferring to West Virginia University with an Associate of Arts or Associate of Science degree will have satisfied the General Education Foundation requirements at WVU.

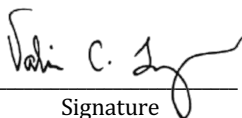
